THE BUSH FOUNDATION

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

ARTICLE I.

Offices

- A. <u>Registered Office</u>. The registered office of The Bush Foundation (the "Foundation") in the State of Minnesota shall be as stated in the Articles of Incorporation of the Foundation (the "Articles"), or such other place within the State as the board of directors may designate from time to time.
- B. <u>Principal Office</u>. The principal office shall be at such place as the board of directors shall designate from time to time. The business of the Foundation shall be transacted from the principal office, and the records of the Foundation shall be kept there.
- C. <u>Other Offices</u>. The Foundation may have such other offices within and without the State of Minnesota as the board of directors may determine.

ARTICLE II.

Members

This Foundation shall have no members.

ARTICLE III.

Board of Directors

- A. <u>General Powers</u>. The business and affairs of the Foundation shall be managed by or under the direction of a board of directors. In addition to the powers conferred upon the board of directors by these Bylaws, the board of directors may exercise all powers of the Foundation and perform all acts which are not prohibited to it by law, by the Articles or these Bylaws, all as may be amended.
- B. <u>Board Composition</u>. The board of directors of the Foundation shall be composed of not less than three (3) nor more than fifteen (15) directors, as determined from time to time by the board of directors of the Foundation. No decrease in the number of directors pursuant to this section shall effect the removal of any director then in office. Directors may only be natural persons, and a majority of Directors must be adults. No vacancy in the number of directors on the board of directors shall render any board action void or voidable.
- C. <u>Term of Office and Election</u>. Each director of this Foundation shall be elected by the board of directors to serve for a term of three (3) years. Notwithstanding the foregoing,

from time to time in order to maintain staggering of directors' terms, the board of directors at its discretion may elect a director for a one (1) or two (2) year term. A director's term shall expire at the annual meeting of directors at which the director must stand for reelection. Each director shall serve until the expiration of his or her term of office, and thereafter until a successor has been elected and qualified, or until the earlier death, resignation, removal, or disqualification of the director. Unless the board of directors determines otherwise, no person may serve more than twelve (12) years as a director, regardless of the number and length of terms served by the director and whether such terms are consecutive.

THE BUSH FOUNDATION

At any meeting for election of directors, whether by reason of expiration of term or vacancy, there shall be placed in nomination at least one name for each position to be filled at the meeting, and each director shall vote for each position separately. A director shall not be disqualified from voting for his or her own re-election. A director presiding at a director's meeting shall not for that reason be disqualified from voting.

- D. <u>Vacancy</u>. If the office of any elected director becomes vacant for any reason, the board of directors may choose a successor by the election of a director by the remaining directors of the Foundation, or the board of directors may leave such position vacant so long as the number of directors does not fall below the minimum number of directors set forth in Paragraph B of this Article III.
- E. <u>Resignation</u>. Any director may resign at any time by giving written notice of such resignation to the Board Chair or Vice Chair of the Foundation. Such resignation shall be effective upon delivery, unless a later date is specified in the notice.
- F. <u>Removal</u>. Any director may be removed with or without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of all directors then in office, excluding the director proposed for removal.

ARTICLE IV.

Board Meetings

- A. <u>Place and Time of Meetings</u>. The board of directors may hold its annual, regular and special meetings at such places, within or without this state, as determined by the Board Chair of the Foundation or his or her designee unless the board of directors determines otherwise. The board of directors may determine that one or more meetings of the board of directors shall be held solely by means of remote communication pursuant to Paragraph I below. Such authorization may be general or confined to specific instances.
- B. <u>Annual Meetings</u>. The board of directors shall hold an annual meeting. At each annual meeting, the board of directors shall elect members of the board of directors in such numbers as required or permitted by the Articles and these Bylaws, shall elect officers and shall conduct such other business as may properly come before it.
- C. <u>Regular Meetings</u>. In addition to the annual meeting, the board of directors shall hold regular meetings as the Board Chair, or his or her designee, shall determine. At each

regular meeting, the board of directors shall conduct such business as may properly come before the meeting.

- D. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the directors of the Foundation may be called upon the request of the Board Chair or designee, or any two (2) or more directors of the Foundation. A person entitled to call a special meeting of the board of directors may make a written request to the Board Chair or President to call the meeting. The Board Chair or President shall give written notice of the meeting in the manner provided below, and the meeting shall be held between two (2) and fourteen (14) days after receipt of the request to call a special meeting. If the Board Chair or President fails to give notice of the meeting within three (3) days from the day on which the request was received by the Board Chair or President, the person or persons who requested the special meeting may fix the time and place of meeting, and give notice thereof.
- E. <u>Notice of Meetings</u>. Not less than five (5) days' written notice of the annual meeting of the board of directors, excluding the day of the meeting, shall be given to all directors. Said notice shall include proposed agenda items, but the failure to include an agenda item in the notice shall not prevent action from being taken with respect to such item.

Not less than five (5) days' written notice of a regular meeting or two (2) days' notice of a special meeting of the board of directors, excluding the day of the meeting, shall be given to all directors. No notice of any meeting, regular or special, need state the purpose of the meeting except as may be specifically required by these Bylaws or otherwise required by law. Notice of a meeting at which an amendment to the Articles of the Foundation will be proposed must contain the substance of the proposed amendment.

Notice shall be delivered personally, sent by facsimile communication, sent by electronic mail, posted on an electronic network together with a separate notice to the director of the specific posting, mailed, first class, postage prepaid, or such other methods as are fair and reasonable as determined in the sole discretion of the President of the Foundation.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no written notice of any meeting of the board of directors is required if the date, time and place of the meeting was announced at a previous meeting of the board. Any director may waive notice of any meeting of the board of directors in writing before, at or after a meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, unless he or she objects at the beginning of the meeting to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and does not participate in the meeting. The waiver shall be filed with the person who has been designated to act as secretary of the meeting, who shall enter the waiver upon the records of the meeting.

F. <u>Quorum and Voting</u>. The presence of a majority of the members of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the board of directors, but the directors present at any meeting, although less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting from time to time. If a quorum is present when a duly called or

held meeting is convened, the directors present may continue to transact business until adjournment, even though the withdrawal of directors originally present leaves less than the proportion or number otherwise required for a quorum. Participation in a meeting by remote communication pursuant to Paragraph I below constitutes presence at a meeting. At any meeting of the board of directors, except as otherwise provided in the Articles or these Bylaws, each director shall be entitled to cast one (1) vote on any question coming before the meeting. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, a majority vote of the directors present at any meeting shall be sufficient to transact any business.

Proxy voting shall not be permitted, and there shall be no cumulative voting.

- G. Rules of Procedure. The board of directors may adopt or establish rules of procedure for conducting meetings provided such rules are not inconsistent with the Articles, these Bylaws or Minnesota law. In the absence of board action the Board Chair may establish rules of procedure for conducting meetings provided such rules are not inconsistent with the Articles, these Bylaws or Minnesota law.
- Н. Actions Without a Meeting. An action required or permitted to be taken at a board meeting may be taken by written action signed by the number of directors that would be required to take the same action at a meeting at which all directors were present, provided that written notice, the proposed action, and any cover materials are provided to all directors by mail or electronic means at least two (2) days before the effective date of the action. If any written action is taken by less than all of the directors entitled to vote, all directors entitled to vote shall be notified immediately of its text and effective date. The failure to provide such notice, however, shall not invalidate such written action. A director who has not signed or consented to the written action has no liability for the action or actions taken thereby. A written action is effective when it is signed by all of the directors required to take the action unless a different effective time is provided in the written action. For purposes of this paragraph, an electronic signature satisfies the requirement of a signature so long as the electronic communication containing the electronic signature sets forth sufficient information from which the Foundation can reasonably conclude that the communication was actually sent by the purported sender.
- I. Meeting by Remote Communication. One or more directors may participate in a meeting of the board of directors by means of a conference telephone or, if authorized by the board of directors, by another means of remote communication, in each case through which that director, other directors so participating, and all directors present at the meeting may participate with each other during the meeting. Alternatively, if authorized by the board of directors, any meeting among directors may be conducted solely by one or more means of remote communication through which all of the directors may participate in the meeting. For these purposes, "remote communication" means communication via electronic communication, conference telephone, video conference, the Internet, or such other means by which persons not physically present in the same location may communicate with each other on a substantially simultaneous basis.

ARTICLE V.

Board Officers

- A. <u>Board Officers</u>. There shall be two (2) required officers of the board, the Board Chair and Vice Chair. Subject to these Bylaws, the board of directors may also elect or appoint one or more additional officers or assistant officers of the board as it may deem convenient or necessary. Officers of the board must be natural persons that the board of directors elects or appoints from among the members of the board. Except as provided in these Bylaws, the board of directors shall fix the powers and duties of all officers of the board.
- B. <u>Board Chair</u>. The Board Chair shall preside over all meetings of the board of directors, provide leadership to the directors, make appointments to committees, serve as principal spokesperson for the board and as board contact for the Foundation's President and perform such other duties as the board of directors may direct.
- C. <u>Vice Chair of the Board</u>. In the absence of the Board Chair or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the Vice Chair of the board shall perform the duties of the Board Chair, and when so acting, shall have all of the powers of and be subject to all of the restrictions upon the Board Chair. The Vice Chair shall cease to perform the duties of the Board Chair when the Board Chair returns or a new Board Chair is elected by the board of directors. Any Vice Chair shall also perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the Board Chair or by resolutions of the board of directors.
- D. <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. The board officers of the Foundation shall be elected annually by the board of directors at the annual meeting of the board of directors. If the election of officers is not held at such meeting, such election shall be held promptly thereafter. New offices may be created and filled at any meeting of the board of directors. Except as otherwise specifically provided in a resolution of the board of directors for election of an officer, the term of office of an officer shall begin on the day of election and the officer's term of office shall continue until the election of the officer's successor or the earlier date of (i) the officer's death, or (ii) the officer's resignation or (iii) the removal of the officer from office.
- E. Removal and Vacancies. Any officer appointed by the board of directors shall hold office at the discretion of the board of directors and may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by a resolution approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of all directors then in office. Any vacancy in an office of the Foundation shall be filled by action of the board of directors.

Corporate Officers

- D. <u>Corporate Officers</u>. There shall be two corporate officers, the President and the Treasurer.
- E. <u>President</u>. The President is hired by the board and shall carry out the day-to-day executive responsibilities for the Foundation, including carrying out the organization's goals and policies. The President will attend all board meetings, report on the progress of the Foundation in achieving its goals, answer questions of the board members and carry out the duties described in the job description for the term set forth therein and subject to all terms of the agreement between the President and the Foundation.

The President shall keep or cause to be kept the minutes of the meetings of the board of directors. He or she shall give or cause to be given all notices of meetings of the board of directors and any other notices in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by law, and in the case of his or her absence or refusal to do so, any such notice may be given by the Board Chair or Vice Chair. He or she shall be the custodian of all the Foundation's books, records, correspondence and other papers. He or she shall execute on behalf of the Foundation all contracts, deeds, conveyances, and other instruments in writing that may be authorized to be so executed by the board of directors. The board may delegate other duties to the President as the board determines necessary.

C. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall be a member of the Foundation staff. The Treasurer reports directly to the President and is appointed by the President. The Treasurer shall keep accurate accounts of all assets of the Foundation and shall deposit all funds received to the credit of the Foundation in such banks and depositories as the board of directors may designate. The Treasurer shall have power to endorse for deposit all notes, checks and drafts received by the Foundation and to disburse the funds of the Foundation as ordered by the board of directors, making proper vouchers for all disbursements. Annually, the Treasurer shall render to the President and the board of directors, an account of the financial condition of the Foundation.

ARTICLE VI.

Compensation

All decisions regarding compensation of directors, officers and committee members shall be determined by the board in adherence to applicable federal tax laws and regulations, and such compensation decisions and data shall be made available to all directors.

ARTICLE VII.

Committees

- A. <u>Committee Charters</u>. The board may establish committees. If it does so, the board shall establish a committee charter which shall specify the function, membership, size, responsibilities, authority and limits on authority of the committee. All committee charters shall be reviewed annually by the board.
- B. <u>Committee Membership</u>. Each committee shall have at least three (3) directors as committee members with voting rights, and may have directors serving as *ex officio*, non-voting members. Non-board members may also serve as members on a committee, with or without voting rights, as determined by the board. The Board Chair shall be an *ex officio*, non-voting member of each committee of the Foundation other than the Executive Committee, on which the Board Chair will serve as chair.
- C. <u>Term of Office</u>. If not otherwise provided in the committee charter, each member of the committee will continue as such until the next annual meeting of the board of directors of the Foundation and until his or her successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member be removed from the committee, or unless such member shall resign or shall otherwise cease to qualify as a member thereof. A committee member may be removed from a committee for any reason as determined by the Board Chair.
- D. <u>Appointment of Members and Chair</u>. The Board Chair shall appoint committee members and designate the committee chair thereof.
- E. <u>Vacancies</u>. Vacancies in membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointments.
- F. Quorum. Unless otherwise provided in the committee charter, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum, and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee. Ex officio committee members do not count toward the quorum.
- G. <u>Procedures</u>. Each such committee shall act in accordance with the procedures and rules, not inconsistent with these Bylaws, adopted or approved by the board of directors of the Foundation, and shall keep full and accurate records of its activities.

ARTICLE VIII.

Delegated Powers

The board may adopt resolutions or policies delegating certain of its authorities under the Articles, Bylaws or Minnesota Statutes Chapter 317A to board committees, board officers or corporate officers. All such delegations shall reserve final authority to the board and set forth: a) to whom the authority is delegated; b) the scope and nature of the delegated

authority; c) all limits on the delegated authority; d) any time limit on the delegation; and e) all reporting obligations. All delegations under this Article shall be included in the Foundation's Board Operating Manual along with committee charters and all other policies made pursuant to these Bylaws.

The President shall report annually on any delegation of the President's authority to Foundation staff.

ARTICLE IX.

Indemnification

Each director, officer, and committee member of the Foundation shall be indemnified by the Foundation in accordance with, and to the fullest extent provided in Section 317A.521 of the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act, as it may from time to time be amended, in connection with a proceeding in which they are or are threatened to be made a party by reason of their action on behalf of the Foundation. In order to avail himself or herself of this indemnification provision, however, a person must: (1) not already be indemnified by another organization in connection to the same proceeding and the same acts or omissions; (2) have acted in good faith with respect to the acts or omissions complained of; (3) have received no improper personal benefit; (4) in the case of a criminal proceeding, have had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful; (5) in the case of a civil proceeding, have reasonably believed that he or she was acting in the best interests of the Foundation. Whenever there has been a finding as provided for in said Section 317A.521 that the prerequisites for indemnification have been met, such indemnification shall be mandatory by the Foundation. This Foundation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who may be indemnified pursuant to this Article X.

ARTICLE X.

Fiscal Matters

- A. <u>Loans</u>. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Foundation, and no evidence of indebtedness other than checks, drafts or other orders for payment of money issued in the ordinary course of business shall be issued in its name unless authorized by the board of directors of the Foundation. Such authorization and approval may be general or confined to specific instances.
- B. <u>Maintenance of Records</u>; <u>Audit</u>. The Foundation shall keep at its registered office correct and complete copies of its Articles and Bylaws, accounting records, and minutes of meetings of the board of directors, and committees having any of the authority of the board of directors for the last six (6) years. All such other records shall be open to inspection upon the demand of any member of the board of directors of the Foundation. The board of directors shall cause the books and records of account of the Foundation to be audited by certified public accountants, to be selected by the board of directors, at such times as it may deem necessary or appropriate.

ARTICLE XI.

Conflict of Interest

The board shall adopt a Conflict of Interest Policy, which shall be reviewed annually by the board for compliance and for any potential revisions.

ARTICLE XII.

Amendments

The Foundation's Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws may be altered, amended or restated by the Board of Directors to omit or include any provision which could be lawfully omitted or included at the time of such amendment. Any number of amendments, or an entire revision or restatement of the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws, may be voted upon at a meeting of the board of directors or by action in writing where due notice of the proposed amendment has been given and shall be adopted upon the affirmative vote of a majority of all directors then in office.
